Gen. Ed. Enhancements

Students should not enroll in Enhancement courses until after taking at least part of the AAGE*. Students with unsatisfactory scores on the Math assessment (i.e., math score below 55) must choose a course from those with an **ME designation; students with unsatisfactory scores on the Communications assessment (i.e., composite essay score under 300) must choose a course from those with a **CE** designation. **Those students with unsatisfactory scores in both areas must take a total of 6 Enhancements hrs; all other students must take 3 hrs.****

***Arkansas Assessment of General Education (AAGE) exam (CAAP or former Rising Junior Exam). Student's test Scores will appear at the beginning of their transcript. At this time, transfer students who have completed both ENG 1013 and Math 1023 prior to transferring to ASU may take an enhancement course of their choice.**
