## Honors Living-Learning Community (HLLC)

### Assignment Process

The Honors Living-Learning Community (HLLC) will be completed for the start of the Fall 2009 semester. All students who are formally admitted to The Honors College have the opportunity to apply to live in the Honors Living-Learning Community. The three residence halls, along with the Honors classroom building, that comprise the HLLC will be home to over 200 Honors students. The available space includes:

- Double rooms with suite-style bathrooms for new freshmen
- Single rooms with suite-style bathrooms for upperclassmen

### New Freshmen

All new freshmen who are formally admitted to The Honors College may apply to live in the HLLC. Students who meet the NEW Honors admission criteria of 27 or higher composite ACT and 3.50 or higher high school GPA will be automatically admitted to The Honors College. Other ASU applicants may be reviewed upon Honors request or at the request of the incoming freshmen. Once students have been formally admitted they receive a congratulatory welcome letter that is their confirmation of admission to The Honors College.

Students who receive the University Honors Scholarship (UHS), Chancellor's Scholarship, or Vice Chancellor's Scholarship all have an equal opportunity to participate in the Honors Living-Learning Community—preference will not be given to one type of scholarship recipient over the other. Assignments in the HLLC will be made on a first come, first serve basis according to the date of deposit. Upon admission to ASU and formal admission to The Honors College, prospective students should complete their housing application and pay their \$100.00 housing deposit no later than the April 1, 2009 priority date. This deposit is refundable and it is in the best interest of the student to pay the deposit as early as possible to increase the likelihood they will be placed in the HLLC—Honors students are not guaranteed placement in the HLLC.

New freshmen may select a double room with suite-style bathroom. Single rooms are not available to new freshmen. Honors students who are interested in living in the HLLC must check "Honors Hall" in the Room/Hall Preference portion of the housing application.

It is strongly recommended that Honors students not live with relatives, high school friends, or acquaintances. The HLLC experience is one that will introduce Honors students to their peers from different backgrounds who have a variety of academic, cultural, and social interests. It is in the best interest of students that they live with roommates that are randomly selected.

New freshmen living in the HLLC are required to:

1. Enroll in at least one Honors course in your first semester at ASU (Fall 2009).
2. Successfully complete at least one Honors course during the 2009-2010 academic year (UHS recipients are required to successfully complete one course each semester—two per academic year.) It is strongly recommended that ALL Honors students complete two Honors courses during each academic year ensuring they remain on track to graduate from Honors.

3. Be enrolled as a full-time (12 credit hours) student each semester (NOTE: Most scholarship recipients are required to be enrolled 15 credit hours each semester).
4. Be in good academic standing in Honors—this is defined as 3.00 cumulative GPA or higher.
5. Be active in The Honors College.

## **Rising Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors (Current Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors)**

All current Honors students may apply to live in the HLLC. Please note that current Honors students were admitted under different admission criteria than the incoming Fall 2009 freshmen class. In order to qualify to live in the Honors Living-Learning Community and to participate in the annual assignment process, Honors students must:

1. Successfully complete at least one Honors course during the 2008-2009 academic year (UHS recipients are required to successfully complete one course each semester—two per academic year.)
2. Be enrolled as a full-time (12 credit hours) student each semester (NOTE: Most scholarship recipients are required to be enrolled 15 credit hours each semester).
3. Be in good academic standing in Honors—this is defined as 3.00 cumulative GPA or higher.
4. Be active in The Honors College.
5. Successfully complete at least one Honors course during the 2009-2010 academic year (UHS recipients are required to successfully complete one course each semester—two per academic year.) It is strongly recommended that ALL Honors students complete two Honors courses during each academic year ensuring they remain on track to graduate from Honors.

Assignments in the HLLC will be made on a first come, first serve basis according to the date of deposit. Current students should submit their completed housing application and pay their \$100.00 housing deposit by January 2009 deadline as established by Residence Life. Assignments will be made in February 2009 according to priority dates determined by the Residence Life office.

Rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors may select a single room with suite-style bathroom. Double rooms are not available to upperclassmen. Honors students who are interested in living in the HLLC must check “Honors Hall” in the Room/Hall Preference portion of the housing application.
