Google Books [Books.Google.com]

Think of it as Google for print. Thousands of digitized books are available for searching, sometimes with full text available online.

Google Scholar [Scholar.Google.com]

Google Scholar uses the familiar Google search engine to parse several online article databases.

Windows Live Academic [Academic.Live.com]

Similar to Google Scholar, Windows Live Academic searches across a wide collection of online articles and publications.

Clusty [Clusty.com]

A collaborative search engine, Clusty provides a mountain of results with tools for sorting and filtering.
