All students must submit a proof of two immunizations against measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) before registering for classes. Failure to submit the form will result in students taking these shots at ASU.

A non-refundable application fee is required of every international applicant. Include an international money order or U.S. check made payable to Arkansas State University or fill out the payment with credit card section in the application form. No wire transfers or application fee waivers.

Affidavit of Support — An original letter in English on official bank stationery must be submitted from a bank or other financial institution in which the sponsor of the student has savings deposits, certificates of deposit, money market certificates or other types of accounts containing readily available funds. This letter must provide a specific amount of funds; a letter without any amount is not acceptable. Letters must be signed and dated within one year of the time the student plans to enroll.
